NCMARTEC on track to be designated a Center of Excellence

Carteret Community College (CCC), a member of the North Carolina Community College System, is one of a handful of community colleges around the country on track to be designated as a Domestic Maritime Center of Excellence through a new initiative under development at the national level. The Domestic Maritime Workforce Training Centers of Excellence is a federal program to advance the capabilities of CCC and other two-year community and technical colleges to secure the talent pipeline for maritime industry jobs by filling a void in training and educational programs. CCC would

be the only North Carolina Community College with such a designation. According to U.S. industry leaders, a shortage of qualified maritime workers is the primary challenge for growth in the domestic maritime sector. Even for entry-level positions, the maritime industry requires technical skills acquired through training and licensing. CCC can offer the required regular training and certifications at an affordable cost.

As a Maritime Center of Excellence, Carteret Community College will become eligible to work with the Maritime Administration (“MARAD”). Through this maritime workforce training consortium with other participating community colleges, CCC will be eligible for cooperative assistance agreements allowing federal funds and technical assistance for maritime education and be able to train more people for maritime industry jobs. The Center of Excellence designation will allow Carteret Community College to expand its capacity to train maritime workers by admitting more students, training faculty, expanding facilities, and creating new maritime career pathways with associate to baccalaureate degree programs.

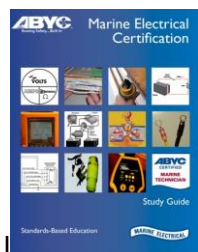

NCMARTEC: ABYC Marine League School



In the Fall of 2017, NCMARTEC became a member of the League of Marine Schools. The American Boat & Yacht Council (ABYC) is a non-profit, member organization that develops voluntary global safety standards for the design, construction, maintenance, and repair of recreational boats.

To address the marine industry's need for post-secondary technical education, ABYC developed the Marine League of Schools. Our students will benefit from instruction rooted in the source of marine industry standards that are applied to the majority of new boat builds as well as the service and repair side of the industry. Knowledge and experience like this gives our students a jump-start in their careers as marine industry professionals and helps them to rise above their peers due to their advanced level knowledge. Provides training and testing for upgrade of existing 100-ton Master license to 200-Ton Master license.

Assistance Towing Endorsement
Provides training and testing for OUPV and Master licenses to provide commercial assistance towing services for hire.
